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From the desk of the coordinator

In the words of former Superior General Antonio Pernia, **Anthropos Institute (AI) should “act as the guardian of the Anthropos tradition of the Society”** (*VERBUM SVD* 45, 1 (2004), 34). This issue of *Interlink* presents the 2024 activities of AI individuals and institutions, dedicated to the social and religious sciences, within the global network of Anthropos Institute International (AII). These efforts contribute to academic scholarship and the continuation of the Anthropos tradition of the Arnoldus family.

Activities of Coordinating Council of Anthropos Institute International

The AII Council for 2022-2024 consisted of Roger Schroeder (USC) as Coordinator; and Stanislaus Grodz (GER) and Michael Sebastian Maria (INM) as members. After considering the consultative vote of AII members, the SVD General Council appointed the following for the triennium of 2025-2026: Schroeder (USC) as coordinator, and Grodz (GER) and **Roger Munsu Vanzila (JAP)** as AII Council members. We thank S.M. Michael for his years of service on the Council and welcome Roger Munsu.

March 2024 Council Meeting

The AII Council held a meeting via Zoom on March 1, 2024. The agenda of their meeting included: 1) report on Zoom meeting of six full AII members in India by S.M. Michael; 2) update on the Editorial Board of the journal *Anthropos*, for which four AII accepted the invitation, and Grodz will set up an initial Zoom meeting with the Board; 3) decision to prepare an AII Zoom discussion in July 2024 on “The SVD Contribution to the Mission of the Church: Role of Anthropology in Missionary Preparation, and Grodz will prepare a background paper with excerpts from articles written by AII members.

December 2024 Council Meeting

A second AII Council meeting was held in St. Augustine, on December 2, 2024 with S. Grodz, S.M. Michael, and R. Schroeder in-person, and R. Munsu via Zoom. The agenda of this meeting included: 1) long discussion (including D.

Piwowarczyk) on the need for lining up a new Editor-in-Chief for the *Anthropos* journal who would not need to live in Germany [**Action Step:** Schroeder to send special message to AII members]; 2) follow-up on suggestion from the July 2024 Zoom discussion to remind the SVD General Council about the importance of anthropological and linguistic studies in initial formation; 3) follow-up on the need to combine the two sets of Anthropos Institute Statutes (General and AI-St. Augustine’s) [**Action Step:** Grodz volunteered to work on this]; 4) the *Anthropology and Mission Bulletin*, which was started in 1989, has now transitioned to being a 500-word entry in every *Arnoldus Nota*, starting in September 2024; 5) update of situation of the “Haus Völker und Kulturen” museum at St. Augustine’s; 6) personnel question of AII member; 7) next AII Zoom session in July 2025

[**Action Step:** Schroeder will solicit suggested topics from the AII members].

Anthropos Journal: Editorial Board and Editor

A major 2023 initiative was the development of a new Editorial Board for the *Anthropos* journal.

The AII Council, in consultation with the journal editor, D. Piwowarczyk, developed a proposed plan to establish a new mode of operation and oversight for editing the journal, which would not require residence in Germany, but would necessarily involve a number of AII members. The proposal was circulated among the members in August, 2023, and there was a very positive response by sixteen AII members that they were willing to contribute to this new editorial framework.

The new structure will consist of two groups. The Editorial Board itself will include a coordinator and about five other members and will serve as the “inner circle” to evaluate submitted manuscripts, formulate policy for the journal, and advise regarding special journal publications and the other two AII book series. The second group will be a wider circle of AII members who will do the actual editorial work on the accepted manuscripts.

Stanislaus Grodz sent out a letter in early 2024 to a select group of AII members with the invitation to be a member of the Editorial Board itself. Grodz agreed to serve as the coordinator, and Piwowarczyk, as the current Editor-in-Chief would also be on the Board. Four AII members agreed to serve on the Editorial Board.

The Editorial Board during its first Zoom meeting on April 9, 2024, dealt with the following: 1) short introductions of participants; 2) description of current situation of the journal; 3) clarifying tasks of the editorial board; and 4) next steps.

Searching for a New Editor-in-Chief

In response to a call for a new Editor-in-Chief in 2021, an AII member came to St. Augustine's in 2022 to join the editorial staff. While he is able to contribute to editorial office work, he will not be able to become the Editor-in-Chief himself.

Action Step: During the AII Council December meeting (as noted above), it was decided that Schroeder would send a special invitation to AII members to consider becoming the Editor-in-Chief, without the necessity of moving to Germany. That person would work with the new international Editorial Board and with a small staff in St. Augustine's (with library and archives), but he would need local office space and support. We need to find a new Editor-in-Chief within the next 12-18 months, or we will need to be shutting down the publication of the journal in three years.

AII Zoom Discussions

In order to strengthen the AII network and provide on-going development, a Zoom discussion was held on July 30, 2024, on the topic "SVD Contributions to the Mission of the Church: Role of Anthropology in Missionary Preparation." The background for the discussion was drawn from excerpts from the following articles by AII members: Required Reading:

Jon Kirby, "Anthropology and Mission in Ghana."
Ennon Mantovani, "Towards a New Vision for Anthropos Institute."

Recommended Reading:

Joachim Piepke, "Anthropos Institute: Basic Research."

Jon Kirby, "Language and Culture Learning in Evangelization."

The lively discussion centered around these questions: 1) Relationship and priority between pure science and applied anthropology; 2) Importance of anthropology for missionary preparation and work; 3) Examples of successes or failures in relation to point #2. Thirteen AII members participated in an engaging conversation.

Action Step:

Schroeder will send a communication to the new SVD General Council about the importance of anthropological and linguistic studies in initial formation. He will also contact the members for suggested topic and format for the next Zoom discussion which is proposed for July 2025.

AII Membership update

The following changes occurred in membership in 2024:

-- Zdzislaw Kupisinski changed from full membership to emeritus status. He became an AII member in 1998.

-- Joachim Piepke died on February 24, 2024. He had worked in Brazil and was a AII member since 1982. He was director of Anthropos Institute over 1986-1998, and then Director of Anthropos

Institute-St. Augustine's over 2001-2017. [Cf. "In Memory of Joachim Piepke SVD (1943-2024)" *VERBUM SVD* 65:1-2 (2024), 175-176.

-- Associate member Josef Thiel died on October 8, 2024. He became an AII member in 1983, and served as Editor-in-Chief of the *Anthropos* journal during the period of 1970-1977, and 1983.

-- Peter Knecht resigned from AII. He worked for most of his life in Japan and became an AII member in 1984.

These four men contributed very much to the work of Anthropos Institute.

-- There are currently thirty-seven full members, three emeriti, and three associate members for a total of forty-three members.

Interculturality activity

A fair number of AII members continued in 2024 to be involved in activities around the world related to interculturality with the SVD and SSPS congregations and many other religious congregations. AII members S.M. Michael and Roger Schroeder continue to serve on the SVD-SSPS **Resource Committee for Interculturality (RCI)**.

Activities of the Co-ordinator

AII coordinator Schroeder submitted the annual report on AII in February 2024, as part of the no. 36 issue of *Interlink* to the SVD Congregational Leadership Team.

In 2024, he met in-person five AII members living in St. Augustine, Germany; S.Michael in Steyl, the Netherlands, and Jon Kirby in Chicago. He had much email and Zoom conversations with many others.

Publications of the Institute

The official publications of the Institute are currently entrusted to the Editorial Board at Anthropos Institute St. Augustine (AI-SA).

Staff

The Editorial Board at Anthropos Institut Sankt Augustin consists of: 5 SVD AI members (Darius Piwowarczyk – the Editor-in-Chief, Vincensius Adi Gunawan, Othmar Gächter, Stanislaw Grodź, and Alexius Dungdung) and a number of lay workers. Joachim Piepke died in February 2024.

Publications

1. *Anthropos* 2024 (vol. 119) – two issues (ca. 750 pages altogether) were prepared. The first one appeared in late May/early June, the second one will appear in January 2025 (delay in typesetting). Vol. 119 contains 27 articles, 4 articles in a new section “Déjà lu”, 4 texts in “Reports and Commentaries”, and 127 book reviews. The section “Survey of Journals” offers an overview of the contents of ca. 140 journals specialized in the field of social and cultural anthropology and the study of religion. 71,5% of the articles were written in English, 17,1% in Spanish, 8,6% in German, and 2,8% in Portuguese. The authors come from 17 countries worldwide (Argentina, Australia, Belgium, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Ecuador, France, Germany, Ghana, India, Indonesia, The Netherlands, Poland, Serbia, Spain, USA).

Two SVDs contributed articles to the volume, one a text of an obituary, and four wrote book reviews for the journal.

Anthropos is available on JSTOR. NOMOS gives the subscribers full access to the electronic version of the journal via its eLibrary (issues older than five years are freely available there but in a limited selection). The editors decided to cease the publication of A&M and contribute a short recommendation of books or articles relevant to the fields of anthropology and mission to every issue of “Arnoldus Nota” (AN) instead. These texts have been already appearing in AN since September 2024.

4. Other matters

The search for a new editor-in-chief of the journal is going on. If it does not bring any positive result, we will need to start taking steps to close down the publication of the journal (it should be a process that can still take some time).

Reports by Individual Members

These reports include publications, conference papers, teaching and other activities/events during 2024. Materials in press will normally be mentioned when they appear. Members, however, sometimes also report on their works in progress to communicate what they are currently working on. These reports reflect the great diversity and depth of the work of the members of Anthropos Institute International.

Teaching:

He signed a renewal of his teaching contract at Divine Word University, Madang, for another three years. He enjoys working with the students and trying to make them take their own education more seriously. His leading unit is “Traditional Village Religions”, which he insists is necessary to make the students job-ready. If they know who they are in terms of their religious background, then then will know what they can do.

Continuing Research Interests

1) He continues visiting the local village court, which is a weekly gathering out in the open under the coconut trees, and taking the DWU students along to see how justice is administered for the community benefit, whether within the rules or outside of the rules.

2) He is revising the memoirs of Fr Wim Valckx

SVD from his time in the East Sepik Province, so that these become resources available for research.

3) Gesch has been working on Riwo village men’s initiation, but his fieldnotes covering historical and mythical origins have gone lost.

Final Visit to Negrie

Gesch paid farewell to Negrie parish in December 2024. He was active there from 1973 to 1983 and wrote his doctoral thesis from fieldwork there, in the context of an on-going, living cargo cult. Last month he visited the village near the station, Malimbanya, where 130 houses and domestic gardens had been burned and destroyed in July 2024. The large village has reverted to bush as the villagers have fled. The whole problem is attributed to a small group of youths, out of control with drink, starting things by killing one of their own members.

Gessinger continues to contribute to the work at Anthropos Institut Sankt Augustin. He keeps track of various new or older copies of the regular review subscriptions. He makes sure that our review copies or annual collections in carton boxes carry the respective signature label. Programs:

1) Two-day national seminar on cultural heritage and empowerment in India and contemporary world from Dec 7 to 8, 2024 was organised by Sanskriti-NEICR, Guwahati. About 60 professors and scholars from various universities have participated and present research papers.

2) 1st two-day Assam Adivasi National seminar from 14th to 15th November 2024 was organised in collaboration with Assam Adivasi Writers. About 125 scholars participated among them about 25 scholars papers were presented

3) Organized another two-day national seminar for the Diocese of Bongaigaon as they are celebrating the silver jubilee of the diocese.

4) 5th National MER-Conference, Indo-Bangla sub zone was organised from Nov. 20 to 24, 2024. The focal theme was SCRIPTING SVD STORY @ 150: Faithful and Creative Disciples in a Wounded World.

Sanskriti – Institute of Dravidian Culture and Research

Thomas Kavumkattayil (K.J.) is the Director of Sanskriti – Institute of Dravidian Culture and Research, Hyderabad, India. See his individual report above.

The vision of Sanskriti (Institute of Dravidian Culture and Research) is to promote intercultural understanding and empowering the marginalized and the downtrodden by way of research, workshops and publications. The Institute has been fully engaged mainly on webinar, seminar and workshops in various educational institutions during the last one year. A two day National Conference on "Demystifying Higher Education in India: Paradigms, Policies and Practices" was conducted on 16 and 17, February, 2024. More than 25 participants presented papers on the subject and an edited volume is being published based on the seminar papers that were presented. The director of Sanskriti attended or presented papers in the following seminars and workshops:

Sanskriti Kendra – Tribal Cultural and Research Centre

All member Ignatius Soreng is Director of Sanskriti Kendra, Sundargarh, India. The center has two specialized activities – a. Fr. Ignatius Soreng, Director, takes care of the cultural department, while b. Fr. Ashok Minj, heads Assistant the activity of legal aid and consultancy.

Activities and Programs:

1) Tribal culture-based activity: Four main activities were conducted in this regard in and through the Center in the year 2024,

a) Tribal Youth Cultural Festival: A one-day tribal youth cultural festival was conducted in the premises of 'Sanskriti Kendra' for cultural training on 1.6.2024. Apart from training and motivation talks and tribal dance competition, presentation of the Creation Myths of Oraon, Munda and Kharia tribes was the highlight of the day. Subsequent discussion and analysis of the myths bore a great impact on the minds of the tribal youth as they learned deeper realities of their own tribes. It was a successful program as not less than 250 participated in the festival.

b) The Lighthouse National Conference 2024: The Conference of the tribal elite and intellectuals is named as the 'Lighthouse Conference' as this group is a source of guiding-light for the tribal communities in the area. Nov.15 2024 twenty-six intellectual including University Professors, College Lecturers, tribal writers and poets and Research scholars of Odisha and Jharkhand State came together for a day's deliberations that included presentation of Research Papers with interaction, recitation of tribal poems, release of books, and release of the tribal e-journal The Whispers. The tribal elite and the intellectuals coming together to deliberate on important tribal issues is a great solace for the tribal communities who are battling with a number of vital issues in their home, social and cultural fronts.

c) A drive to develop tribal creative literature: It is said that a language that does not have a written literature dies out. A conscious effort is initiated by 'Sanskriti Kendra' to develop tribal creative literature by hosting a forum and boosting the tribal elite, educated and the intellectuals to come up with their creative writings and publications. 'Sanskriti Kendra' also pushes and promotes their publication with proper identity as ISBN so that they are not ignored in the official and intellectual circle. This year, there was the release of two books published by tribal writers – one, Funda (a novel in Kharia language) written by Ignatius Soreng, and two, Kahani a collection of poems in Sadri language written by Dr. Ajit Kumar Kullu, Asst.Professor, Sambalpur University. This has created a positive impact on many as an interest is created among the tribal intellectuals to come up with their own writings and publications in course of time.

d) Bringing out a tribal e-magazine: The tribal e-magazine brought out by Sanskriti Kendra is 'The Whispers: a journal of tribal life, literatures and cultures' named thewhispersjournal.com. This is a multi-lingual journal that includes nine languages (four tribal languages – Oraon, Munda, Kisan and Kharia, two local languages – Sadri and Kenta, and three national-International languages – Hindi, Odia and English). It also is a and multi-dimensional journal as it includes four sections – Research articles, Poems, Short Stories and Folk tales. It is to be a biennial journal providing a recognized forum to the educated and intellectual scholars, writers and poets to come up with their literary outputs in order to serve their own communities.

2) Legal aid and consultancy: Fr. Ashok Minj SVD, the Assistant Director cum treasurer of the Center, is an active Advocate, and he shuffles between various courts in the district daily. He also attends the High court of the State as per need fighting cases of the poor and giving them legal advice. Loaded with his legal activities he also finds time to participate in the other activities of the center and thus advancing the aim and objectives of the center in the right direction.

Tamale Institute of Cross-Cultural Studies (TICCS)

(TICCS was founded by AII member Jon Kirby, SVD in 1983, as an anthropological research and

teaching institute for the SVD of the Ghana Province and the Catholic Archdiocese of Tamale. The current director of TICCS is Samuel Adu, SVD since September, 2023. He holds a Licenciante in Missiology from the Pontifical Gregorian University, Rome and has been serving as a resource person for TICCS. TICCS has seventeen (17) staff in total: three senior staff, eleven regular staff and three part-time workers.

Programs:

1) A month-long Cross Cultural Orientation Workshop for New Missionaries was conducted in May 2024 for three religious belonging to the Apostles of the Sacred Heart of Jesus Congregation participated in the one-month residential course.

2) Pastoral Year Preparatory Course for Seminarians of St. Victor Major Seminary, was conducted in June 2024 for seventeen seminarians from six different dioceses and a religious congregation. This was a two-week non-residential workshop.

3) A second Cross Cultural Orientation Workshop for New Missionaries was conducted in September 2024. The total of sixteen participants was the largest number in recent years. Participants were from the following orders: SVD, Sisters Servants of the Holy Spirit, Missionaries of Africa, Sisters of the Apostles of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, Sisters of Jesus Mary and Joseph, Franciscan Missionaries of Mary, and OFM Franciscan Capuchin. The high number of participants can be attributable to the intensified advertisement for the programme and the subsidized participation fee. TICCS from the Koch Foundation.

Other Organizations:

1) ADRO, an NGO working in the north, held their programmes in TICCS in August 2024.

2) Trent-in-Ghana (a programme organised and run by Trent University) used TICCS for their one-month programme with the University for Development Studies (UDS), Tamale. The students stayed in TICCS in November 2024.

3) The year 2024 recorded a little above 2000 people using the facilities.
